- In 1877, twenty-two Poles visited this community and decided to settle in the area.
- This immigrant from Europe started arriving in Arkansas in the 1820s and continued a steady stream of immigration throughout the 19th century.
- Fanny Block and her husband Abraham were the first of this group to settle in Arkansas. By 1825 the Blocks owned a store in Washington, Arkansas.
- Rosa Zagnoni, a representative from this group, was named Poet Laureate of Arkansas in 1953.
- Many of the early settlers of this group came from Olympia and Sparta.
- In October 1980, a large group of immigrants from this group came through Fort Chaffee after they were allowed to leave Cuba by communist dictator Fidel Castro.
- This group migrated from their North Pacific archipelago to northwestern Arkansas in the 1980s.
- Joe Hong owned a grocery store in Tyronza (Poinsett County) in the 1950s and is representative of this ethnic group in Arkansas.
- About 15,000 believers of this religious group live in Arkansas in the early twenty-first century.
- The earliest known mosque in Arkansas for these worshipers was established in 1969 in Little Rock.
