
- This Little Rock nonprofit organization provides support for LGBTQ+ young adults experiencing homelessness in central Arkansas, helping with housing, resources, case management, and job skills training.
- An author, activist, and internet celebrity, this outspoken proponent of gay rights received the Equality Award from the Human Rights Campaign in 2007 and the American Humanist Association's LGBT Humanist Award in 2012.
- A leading writer of local color stories and journalistic essays, this author used a pseudonym because it was gender-neutral.
- This author's nine novels featuring African American men in gay and bisexual relationships have sold more than three million copies.
- This author's first novel, *Boys Like Us* (1991), received praise from the *New York Times*, but he had little time to enjoy the success that followed its publication, as he died from AIDS-related complications in September 1991.
- This computer game designer created a game in 1983 that was ranked third on *Computer Gaming World's* 1996 list of the best games of all time.
- This author's memoir, which was adapted into a movie in 2018, recounts his experiences at the Memphis, Tennessee, "ex-gay" therapy program Love in Action.
- This painter and mixed media artist's work has achieved national acclaim for confronting institutional racism and homophobia.
- This White County native is the singer and songwriter for Gossip as well as a model and fashion
 designer who promotes positive body image and who is an outspoken supporter of LGBTQ+
 rights.
- This activist and his husband organized the first Conway Pride Parade in 2004.





